When I was younger, my understanding of the term "resolution" was limited to the list of changes many people intend to make at the beginning of a new year. And because of how many of those items on people's lists go unfulfilled, the word "resolution", in my head, was a fairly soft word. It was a word people used when they intended to do something, but didn't follow through. It was a term related to being unrealistic, describing either the practice of wishful thinking or setting unattainable goals.

But this understanding I had of the term "resolution" is far from the actual meaning of the word. In fact, it is pretty much the polar opposite of the dictionary definition of the term! To be "resolute" is to be firm, to be set, to be determined; and "resolutions" are firm decisions that have been set in place. There is nothing soft about this word! It is a strong word that describes how a thing, or a person, is firmly set upon a principle or a course of action.

God's Word is full of examples of men and women who were "resolute" – who, by the grace and work of God, were set in their faith and course of action. God's Word is also filled with words that encourage us to follow in those footsteps and be "resolute" ourselves – to be people who are standing firm and set on the course of our Lord Jesus Christ. And God's Word, one could say, is the ultimate "resolution"! God's Word is His revelation to us of his unfailing, eternal plans for the universe.

So, as we begin the year 2017, be encouraged by these words of the Lord that call us to be "resolute" as we live out our faith in Christ:

Let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. -Galatians 6:9 Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. -Romans 12:11

new year – time for New Year's Resolutions. Have you made yours? Probably the most common New Year's resolution is to lose weight. Or spend more time with family. Have you ever kept your New Year's resolutions? Some solve that problem simply by not making any – I'm in that camp!

But I want this year to be different, so this year I invite you to join me in resolving to follow the six Marks of Discipleship:

- 1. **Pray daily:** Resolve to start the day with prayer and end the day with prayer. If you want a good example to follow, the Portals of Prayer booklet offers Martin Luther's Morning and Evening Prayer. Resolve to spend some time alone with God in Prayer.
- 2. **Worship Weekly:** Worship is the gathering of God's people around Word and Sacrament. Worshiping together renews us and strengthens us. Resolve this year to worship regularly.
- 3. **Read the Bible:** I can tell you from experience that this is one of the hardest resolutions to keep. When we get busy, the first thing to go is Bible reading. There are many Bible reading plans available. It can be as simple as reading a chapter or as committed as reading the Bible through in a year. Resolve to spend time reading the Bible.
- 4. **Serve:** There are many ways and opportunities to serve at Hope Lutheran. Don't wait to be asked volunteer! And if you have a new idea, that would be great. Service extends beyond the church. Look for ways to help the less fortunate.

- 5. **Spiritual Friendships:** Spiritual friendships help hold us accountable. A Spiritual friend encourages us to pray and encourage one another. A spiritual friendship can be the one place we can turn when we are faced with a crisis.
- 6. **Give Time, Talents and Resources:** I know what you're thinking. If this is a stewardship column, why didn't I just start with this one? The answer is simple. If you resolve and keep the first 5 Marks of Discipleship, giving of your Time, Talents, and Resources will come naturally. For in our giving, what we offer is symbolic of the giving of one's self to God who loves us with an everlasting love. For the New Year, resolve to increase your giving by 1%. Or, I would challenge you to try tithing for a year. You will be amazed at the ways God returns His blessings.

There you have it – six resolutions for the New Year. Six Marks of Discipleship. And I can already tell you, you won't keep all six resolutions – at least not completely! But we need to start somewhere, sometime.

The purpose of the marks of discipleship is not to create super Christians or any kind of spiritual elite. No one earns salvation or gains any special favor from God by practicing the marks. They are simply habits (resolutions) of the soul that open us to the wonder and mystery of God's active presence in our lives. They keep us focused; they fix our attention on the things of God.
