This month I want to take the opportunity of this article to let you all know about a new development God is bringing about in the Church called The Nexus Institute.

If you remember back to Lent a couple of years ago, one of the guest preachers who shared the Gospel during a Wednesday evening service here at Hope Lutheran was a man named Dr. Kyle Fever, who at that time served full time for Ingham-Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camps. Since that time, Kyle has moved to Des Moines, and is building and initiating what is called The Nexus Institute at Grand View University.

What is The Nexus Institute? I will let Kyle himself explain it to you through some excerpts from an article he wrote for the LCMC's quarterly publication By The Word...

"The Nexus Institute at Grand View University in Des Moines, IA, exists to transform the landscape of the church by investing in high school youth and developing their potential as theological leaders driven by the Gospel of Jesus Christ...The Nexus Institute is a year-long program that partners with local congregations to develop youth into theological leaders in the church and in the world. At Nexus, young adults experience intentional community of Christ-centered theological learning and leadership development, as well as ongoing equipping and development as Nexus participants take significant steps of theological leadership in the context of the local church."

Personally, I am extremely excited and encouraged that God will use The Nexus Institute to begin the process of raising up pastors and church leaders much earlier on in people's lives. Considering a call to serve the Lord in ministry doesn't have to happen either in college or many years later – these 10th through 12th graders who will be participating in Nexus (and perhaps we might have some from our own congregation participate!) will be blessed as they learn, grow and mature in faith, and prayerfully consider if a future in ministry may be where the Lord is leading them.

I encourage you to keep The Nexus Institute in your prayers in these initial stages of its existence and work, and if you know anyone who is a sophomore, junior or senior in high school, and think they might be a good fit for the program, encourage them to consider being a part of what God is doing there! Sowing Seeds of Stewardship John W. Jensen

Spring is here! Or, at least on May 1st, it's supposed to be. But there's still snow in the forecast! Spring is a new start. Bright colors replace the browns and grays of winter. We look forward to more daylight and warmer temperatures. Everything becomes new again.

For believers, spring has the added benefit of reminding us that God's all about new stuff. In fact, Jesus promised to make everything new one day (Revelation 21:5 NIV). In the meantime, He gives us glimpses of coming attractions through spring.

To help celebrate the shift from one season to another, let's look at some verses that hit on some of the best themes of spring. Let them soak into your soul like a warm sun on a cloudless day.

Growth: That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers. — Psalm 1:3, NIV

Spring is a time for growth. In nature, that comes from the right combination of sunlight and water. For our spiritual lives, it comes from the right combination of time with God in His Word and time with other Christians in fellowship. The alternative is to be chaff that blows away and comes to nothing.

Starting Over: As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth. – Hosea 6:3, NIV

Everybody needs forgiveness. We need God to appear and let us know that we're back on track with Him. He's ready to give us that kind of healing. We just have to turn back to Him.

Provision: I will send rain on your land in its season, both autumn and spring rains, so that you may gather in your grain, new wine and olive oil. – Deuteronomy 11:14, NIV

The Christian life is a balancing act between working like everything depends on you and trusting like everything depends on God. He will send the rains you need, but you've also got to do your part by working the harvest.

Learning: Let my teaching fall like rain and my words descend like dew, like showers on new grass, like abundant rain on tender plants. — Deuteronomy 32:2, NIV

You're never too old to learn a little more about God and His goodness. Just like rain provides nourishment to the plants, His Word reaches into our hearts and shows us things that we never would have imagined.

Renewal: Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. – Psalm 51:10, NIV

God's in the renovation business. He takes what's old and broken down and transforms it into something incredible. If you've got an area of your life that needs some renewal, He's more than ready to meet you where you are.

Peace: Why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. — Matthew 6:28-29, NIV

Take a look at the flowers and plants blooming around you, the trees as they leaf out. They didn't worry their way to awesomeness. And you can't either. God cares about you, so let Him carry your worries and fears ("Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." 1 Peter 5:7 NIV).

Whether it's a long walk on a sunny day, enjoying time in the garden, or reflecting on God's creation from the seat of a tractor, soak up the blessings of spring. Let the sights, sounds and smells of a new season bring something new to life in you.
