Here are some words from the Daily Reform devotional series from Sola Publishing that do well, I think, to encapsulate the significance of scripture’s revelation of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen:

On Mount Calvary, God has made for all peoples a great and living feast. Come and dine on the Bread of Life, the Living Water, and the wine of the Lamb. He has destroyed in that mountainside tomb the surface of its covering that barred all peoples, the veil that kept out all nations. He has swallowed up death forever! The Lord would wipe away the tears from your eyes and off the faces of history. He takes away the disgrace of his creation throughout all the earth, for Yahweh has made it so by his own decree. “Every knee shall bow and every tongue confess”: Behold, this is our God! He alone can save us! This is Yahweh! We have waited for him. There will be what seem to be setbacks in our joy, but we are to live in his joy even in such moments. For he is the greater joy. We will be glad and rejoice in his salvation!

I encourage you to come together with the body of Christ and rejoice in our great salvation at the following times during Holy Week:

Women of Hope Spring gathering will be **April 11**, starting with a brief meeting and then program and fellowship.



Treasurer's Report – General Fund \$1659.08, Love Fund \$994.44. M/S/C Doris/Tracy to approve the report. The following bills were presented: \$250.42 quilt room lumber (Tom Goeken), \$11.49 kitchen supplies (Arlene Meyer), and \$200 donation for the mission trip chaperone. M/S/C Kara/Holly.

Mission Action - 10 ladies made 6 quilts on the last quilt day. The next quilt day will be March 28th. Discussion was held on Fabric Warehouse closing and if any purchases were needed to be made.

Mission Communities - Kaden's Klostet donation box is in the narthex along with a list of needed items. MISSION MEMO

CHURCH OF THE DAMASCUS ROAD

One of the ministries our Mission Outreach funds support is the congregation of inmates inside the correctional facilities at Rockwell City and Fort Dodge. In their newsletters, inmates share poetry, artwork, and other writings. From the March edition - drawing and writing both are by James:

When I look at the world in which I live I see nothing but stone buildings and metal fences with razor wire, lost faces, and hopeless dreams to last a lifetime.

But Christ is here with us. All we have to do is look up and see him. For me, it's the tall fences that surround me. For every inch of the fence I see there are crosses and the hands of all the people of the world linked together to form Christianity.

The chain links are what hold Christianity together, and the metal rods that form the cross is Christ keeping us straight and strong.

Even though we sway from side to side and bend to the wind, in which is the bad in prison, there still stands the fence, and if it breaks, it is fixed by helping hands and once again stands tall.

For there might be holes in the fence to look out through, but if you back up and look again, there's the cross and the linked hands willing to support you, to help you, to keep you safe, and with Christ in your heart, you can be saved as well.

Just take a walk around the places in which we live and Christ will show himself to you. All you have to do is look up and see that he is everywhere, from the smallest grain of sand to the great sky above — and somewhere in the middle of all that is Christ.
